STEERING COMMITTEE

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The International Conference on Smart Systems and Technologies – **SST 2026** will host a **PhD Forum** on Friday, **October 30, 2026**, at the Hotel Osijek in Osijek, Croatia, the venue of the main conference.

The PhD Forum provides an opportunity for doctoral students to present their work related to the SST 2026 conference topics to a wider community of researchers from academia and industry. Its aim is also to encourage interaction and networking among doctoral students from different universities.

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

Doctoral students are invited to submit a **two-page extended abstract** for review and possible inclusion in the PhD Forum program. Details are available at: [<https://sst-conference.org/index.php/phd-forum-2026>].

The extended abstracts should be formatted according to the SST 2026 paper submission instructions, but limited to two (2) pages in total, and submitted electronically before the submission deadline, via [EasyChair \(PhD Forum track\)](#). The extended abstract should include the title; the names and affiliations of the student and their advisor(s); a summary of research goals and results (up to 150 words); a presentation of the research topic; any graphical illustrations that support the presentation; and a list of references.

The authors of **accepted submissions** will be asked to prepare a **poster**, to be personally presented by the doctoral student at the PhD Forum. The poster should be printed on standard A1 (594 × 841 mm), portrait orientation. An optional poster template will be provided for your convenience.

The PhD Forum will feature a poster session, introduced by fast-paced, 2-minute pitch talks from each student. The pitch talk should offer a brief overview of one's doctoral research to spark interest and encourage discussion during the following poster session.

REVIEW PROCESS

To keep within the time limits of PhD Forum as a whole, the number of PhD presentations/posters will be limited to 20. Submissions will be reviewed for relevance, innovation, and presentation quality. Accepted works will appear in the SST 2026 PhD Forum Book of Abstracts, published post-conference.

REGISTRATION

For authors of accepted presentations/posters, the **PhD Forum registration fee is 150 EUR** and it includes: 1) PhD Forum participation; 2) Book of Abstracts (electronic version); 3) access to other SST 2026 conference sessions on the day of the PhD Forum; 4) coffee breaks and lunch on the day of the PhD Forum.
